What will the impact be?

Schools and educational institutions depend on the use of various types of personal data, mainly children's and adolescents', which have special protection in the LGPD. The new law applies to the data belonging to students, parents, legal guardians, employees and third parties (individuals).

What are the main issues to be aware of?

- 1 School records
- 2 Performance evaluations
- 3 Food preferences
- 4 Data collected on digital platforms
- 5 Bank and billing details
- 6 Data from monitoring cameras, access registrations, etc.
- 7 Employee data
- 8 Monitoring the use of technology such as WIFI and computers

Sensitive Data requires additional care



Children under 12: consent must be sought from parents or guardians for the use of their data, which should always be in the best interest of the child
